This talk

- ▶ We look at some data that are not predicted by existing analyses.
- ▶ The data involve a set of contrasts between various types of expressive nouns in Italian (**cazzo, merda, coglione**).
- ▶ These contrasts (in part) fit in the theory of semilexicality proposed by Cavigrani-Pots (2020), but also suggest an extension of it (along the lines of Postma 1995).

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One predicative, and two expressive positions

- (3) a. Quell' articolo è una **merda**. PREDICATIVE POS.
 that paper is a shit
 'That paper is shit.'
- b. Che **merda** di articolo! EXPRESSIVE POS. 1
 what shit of paper
 'What a shit of a paper!'
- c. Che articolo di **merda**! EXPRESSIVE POS. 2
 what paper of shit
 'What a shit of a paper!'

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Stacking

- ▶ EP1: cazzo > merda > RefN
- ▶ EP2: RefN > merda > cazzo

Stacking - EP1 + EP1 and EP2 + EP2

- (4) Che **cazzo** di **merda** di articolo!
what dick of shit of paper!
- (5) *Che **merda** di **cazzo** di articolo!
what shit of dick of paper!
- ▶ ***merda** > **cazzo**

Stacking - EP1 + EP1 and EP2 + EP2

(4) Che **cazzo** di **merda** di articolo!
what dick of shit of paper!

(5) *Che **merda** di **cazzo** di articolo!
what shit of dick of paper!

► ***merda** > **cazzo**

(6) ?Che articolo di **merda** del **cazzo**!
what paper of shit of dick!

(7) *Che articolo del **cazzo** di **merda**!
what paper of dick of shit!

► ***cazzo** > **merda**

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Mass/count

- (8) Che articolo **del cazzo** / **di merda!**
What paper of.the dick / of shit

- ▶ **cazzo** is COUNT
- ▶ **merda** is MASS

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#-agreement

- ▶ cazzo
 - ▶ never #-agrees with PL RefN and D, always SG
 - ▶ it lacks the feature PL
 - ▶ its SG feature is either absent or invisible
- ▶ merda
 - ▶ #-agrees with PL RefN and D
 - ▶ it can have a (visible) feature PL

- b. Quei **cazzo** di articoli!
 Those dick of papers
- c. ?Quel **cazzo** di articoli!
 That dick of papers

#-agreement - EP1

- (10) a. Quelle **merde** di articoli!
 Those shits of papers
 b. Quelle ***merda** di articoli!
 Those shit of papers
 c. ?Quella **merda** di articoli!
 That shit of papers

#-agreement - EP2

- (11) Quegli articoli *dei **cazzi** / *delle **merde!**
Those papers of.the dicks / of.the shits
- (12) Quegli articoli del **cazzo** / di **merda!**
Those papers of.the dick / of shit

- ▶ ExprNs can only occur in the SG
- ▶ No #-agreement with RefN

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Gender agreement

- ▶ **cazzo**
 - ▶ optionally transparent for GENDER agreement
 - ▶ D can either agree with **cazzo**, or with RefN (across **cazzo**)
 - ▶ GENDER feature can either be present or absent/invisible
- ▶ **merda**
 - ▶ visible for GENDER agreement
 - ▶ D cannot agree with RefN across **merda**
 - ▶ GENDER feature is present and active

Gender agreement - EP1

- (13) a. DET. __ cazzo di lettera
 that. __ dick.M of letter.F
 b. DET. __ merda di articolo
 that. __ shit.F of paper.M

Gender agreement - EP1

- (14) a. Quel **cazzo** di lettera
 that.M dick.M of letter.F
 b. Quella **cazzo** di lettera
 that.F dick.M of letter.F

Gender agreement - EP1

- (14) a. Quel **cazzo** di lettera
 that.M dick.M of letter.F
 b. Quella **cazzo** di lettera
 that.F dick.M of letter.F
- (15) a. Quella **merda** di articolo
 that.F shit.F of paper.M
 b. *Quel **merda** di articolo
 that.M shit.F of paper.M

Gender agreement - EP2

- (16) a. Quella lettera del **cazzo**
that.F letter.F of.the dick.M
b. *Quel lettera del **cazzo**
that.M letter.F of.the dick.M
- (17) a. Quell' articolo di **merda**
this.M paper.M of shit.F
b. *Quella articolo di **merda**
this.F paper.M of shit.F

- ▶ D can only agree with RefN (and not with ExprN)

Towards an analysis

Claim

Expressive nouns represent various stages of loss of meaning, where first lexical meaning is lost, then functional meaning, until only expressive meaning remains.




Towards an analysis


- ▶ The loss of meaning implies a progressive loss of functional structure above the root (Klockmann 2017; Cavigani-Pots 2020)
- ▶ Stage 1: [PL [# [G [N, CONCEPT]]]] ⇒ **coglione**-e, -i
- ▶ Stage 2: [PL [# [F [G [N]]]]] ⇒ **merda**-a, -e
- ▶ Stage 3: [# [G [N]]] ⇒ **cazzo** (visible for D AGREE)
- ▶ Stage 4: [N] ⇒ **cazzo** (invisible for D AGREE)

(18) SGP \Leftrightarrow -o




(19) SGP \Leftrightarrow -a



(19) $\text{SGP} \Leftrightarrow -a$




(20) *Superset Principle*


L can spell out subsets of its specification.





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Conclusions

- ▶ We looked at some data that are problematic for existing analyses
 - ▶ stacking of ExprNs
 - ▶ ordering restrictions on stacked ExprNs
 - ▶ failure of **cazzo** to occur predicatively
- ▶ we proposed a sequence of stages of loss of meaning, where first lexical meaning is lost, then functional meaning, until only expressive meaning remains.
